CURRICULUM

Within the curriculum of Catholic schools there are seven Key Learning Areas which provide students with a broad and balanced education. The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA), is responsible for developing the syllabus to be taught in all New South Wales schools, from Kindergarten through to Year 12.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOURS FOR LEARNING

The goal of PB4L is to help parents/carers and school staff create and maintain a safe, supportive, learning environment, promote positive life skills and reduce negative behaviours so that all children can succeed in school. The PB4L Framework focuses on building a positive environment for students and staff by establishing clear expectations for students and taking active, explicit steps in teaching, modelling and reinforcing appropriate behaviours school-wide.

We also offer a range of gifted and talented opportunities that promote independent learning and discovery.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER

All Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students are encouraged and supported to reach their full potential and to embrace their culture and identity. All students acknowledge, appreciate and value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories and cultures and commit to ongoing reconciliation. Aboriginal Education Assistants (AEA) are employed at St John's to support students, liaise with families and immerse the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and customs across the school community.
